Big News for Protected Cropping Growers...

Australia is officially shifting from eradication to management of Tomato Brown Rugose Fruit Virus (ToBRFV) — a change long advocated by PCA and our members.

“This outcome reflects what can be achieved when industry unites around a common goal,” said Andrew Tout, Chair of PCA. “Growers have stood up, contributed time and resources, and brought practical on-farm knowledge into the national policy space.”

This marks a more practical, evidence-based approach that puts grower experience and industry resilience at the centre.

“Growers have real skin in the game. They understand the risks and know how to manage viruses effectively on-farm.” Says Michael Simonetta (Perfection Fresh).

We’re proud to have led this advocacy work — and grateful to the growers, businesses, and stakeholders who made it possible.

Projects Update

Last Friday the RMCG group delivered an IPM workshop which focused on reducing chemical use in the New South Wales cut flower industry, which was kindly hosted by Brimstone Waratahs, at their site at The Oaks, NSW, 2570.

The workshop itself was designed to Inform and upskill growers to manage pest and disease issues using an integrated approach (leading to a reduction in chemical use) and also advise on best practice chemical use and storage.

Presenters at the event included three well known industry identities, namely:

- Assoc. Prof Robert Spooner-Hart - Western Sydney University,
- Dr. Len Tesoriero - Crop Doc Consulting
- Tony Bundock MEd - Protected Cropping Australia | Genesis Horticulture
- Acting as MC for the event was Jesse Clune of RMCG group.
- The event was well attended with 15 growers and industry representatives on site.

Robert and Len opened the event with a presentation providing an introduction to IPDM, common pest and diseases, and their management, which then transitioned into a scouting field walk to take a practical look at the issues being faced by Gordon and the team at Brimstone Waratahs. This provided an excellent opportunity for the participants to examine first hand some specific disease and pest issues, and the control measures that could be utilised.

The event then proceeded with a presentation by Tony on chemical use and safe handling practices, and how an integrated pest management approach can utilise chemical applications as a control measure.

To further assist the growers, Garden City Plastics had kindly donated a number of 0.5 litre measuring jugs which the growers were able to take away with them from the event.

The day concluded with a bbq and networking session. There are plans for additional workshops in the next couple of months and these will be widely advertised.

The purpose of this newsletter is to keep you in touch with important news about R&D occurring in your industry, as well as ensure that you are informed in a timely way about changes to employment law, workplace health & safety, upcoming events and other information necessary to help you to run your berry business effectively.

Dear <<First Name>>,

Poor northern NSW has copped it again with huge rainfall and flooding. This time, the berry industry has not escaped with reports of orchards underwater, infrastructure damage, and lack of access to blocks, causing pest and disease issues. Initial reports indicate that crops under tunnels have fared better, but it has been a devastating event for many blueberry and Rubus growers.

We are working with the NSW DPI to determine damage levels, and I encourage anyone with damage to [fill out this survey](#). If you would rather just talk to someone, please get in touch with Gaius, Melinda or myself.

A major focus for the Berries Australia team is AgVet chemical management, especially the recent news that blueberries will no longer be considered a 'minor use' crop. We
