PROTECTED CROPPING AUSTRALIA ARE CURRENTLY WORKING WITH LOCAL LAND SERVICES NSW, TO DELUVER THE EARLY NEEDS RECOVERY PROJECT

The project itself is primarily designed to give primary producers in the most flood impacted regions of NSW access to a range of technical support and recovery advice. The services provided under the program have been designed and delivered in partnership with industry to ensure that the unique recovery needs of the most impacted sectors are met. The program is also looking to assist growers in making the 'next step', in terms of transitioning from soil based production to 'soilless' production. This has been achieved by the running of two seminars to date with further events planned.

Leading the PCA involvement in the project is ex PCA board member, Tony Bundock. Tony has an extensive background in protected cropping and training delivery. As part of his role, Tony is also writing a number of resources to aid growers in their transitional 'journey' as well as participating in site visits and the delivery of seminars. 
