
The Industry Advisory Council (IAC) meets every second month and is led by our Deputy Chair, Andrew McIlwain.



Industry update: Tomato brown rugose fruit virus response in South Australia

The Department of Primary Industries and Regions (PIRSA) continues to respond to the detection of Tomato brown rugose fruit virus (ToBRFV) in the Northern Adelaide Plains.

Current situation

PIRSA is becoming confident that it has determined the extent of the virus, although we will continue with surveillance and tracing.

Three businesses are still confirmed with ToBRFV in South Australia and are under quarantine to prevent the spread of virus from those properties. 14 properties have now been advised that ToBRFV has **not** been detected in their test samples.

We have now received test results for over 3,000 samples and our Case Managers will continue to contact businesses with results as they come in.
