#### Knowledge-makers joining with knowledge-users


There will be opportunities during meal breaks, at the Welcome Cocktails and during the farm tours for everyone to network and gain a better understanding across these fields.

## PCA Growers Workshop By LEN TESORIERO



Woolgoolga NSW May 14th 2015

Protected Cropping Australia

Over 50 growers and allied industry representatives attended a PCA workshop held at the Woolgoolga Bowling Club on Thursday 14th May.

Woolgoolga is located near Coffs Harbour on the Mid-North NSW Coast and is a thriving region for the production of greenhouse vegetables and blueberries.

The temperate maritime climate provides ideal conditions for efficient greenhouse vegetable production and extends the blueberry fruiting season.

Growers heard from NSW DPI staff Phil Wilk and Dr Sophie Parks with updates of research into blueberry diseases and evaluation of reflective mulches for improved production and quality.

Phil detailed progress in field trials being led by Dr Rosalie Daniel to evaluate fungicides for the control of blueberry rust.

Sophie outlined how reflective mulches hasten fruit maturity and flavour.

Phill Ritchie of Rijk Zwaan spoke about the potential for new blue-leaf cucumber varieties he's trialing in the district and how they are showing improved vigour and tolerance to diseases.


Dr Len Tesoriero spoke about how to recognise and be prepared for Cucumber green mottle mosaic virus, an exotic disease threat that was recently found on cucumbers near Darwin.

Zappia are a prominent Sydney Market agent who are developing their product range and geographical sources.
